Three days per week of class time for 19 weeks plus 185 hours of work placement.

Fees

Full fee	\$1018.00

Fees are due before commencement of the course.
Enrolments will be processed in order of payment.

Course Outline

This nationally recognised qualification is delivered part-time and is aimed at people who are working or wish to work with children. This course involves the use of organisational policies, procedures and individual children's profiles to plan activities and provide care to children, facilitating their leisure and play and enabling them to achieve their developmental outcomes.

Mode of Study

This course has a nominal duration of 568 hours. This is undertaken as a combination of class based activities, excursions, work placement and independent learning tasks with some online components.

Students must attend classes as timetabled and allow time for additional independent study. Work placement totalling 185 hours in an approved centre is a requirement for successful completion of the course.

Assessment Methods

Assessments are undertaken using a variety of methods including, observation, written assignments/projects, case studies, scenarios, role plays, oral/written questioning and work placement tasks.

Employment Pathway

Depending on the setting, workers may work under direct supervision or autonomously. In some settings, the worker may also have limited supervisory responsibilities of volunteers.

Occupational names may include Child Care Assistant, Unqualified Child Care Worker, Nanny
