ORGANISATIONAL CONTEXT

PRIMARY OBJECTIVES

This position forms part of the bestchance Graduate Program. Working across the Early Years, Children's Therapy Services and Cheshire School teams, this role will focus on providing high quality services, integrating the developmental and therapeutic needs of children.

With guidance and supervision from each of the respective teams, this role will support key activities in building the capacity of children, families and communities.

KEY RESULT AREAS AND RESPONSIBILITIES

Early Years Rotation – Diploma Educator

- Implement high quality educational programs and daily routines for individuals and groups based on the strengths and interests of children.
- Create a safe and welcoming environment for the children and families attending the kindergarten and ensure every reasonable precaution is taken to protect children from hazards.
- Prepare and reset activities and learning experiences alongside other educators in the service.
- Work with individuals and groups of children.
- Establish and maintain records and documentation as required.
- Attend to the physical, social and emotional needs of the children as required.
- Develop positive relationships and effective communication with families based on mutual respect.
- Consult with families on issues of children's development and programming.
- Relate sensitively to people, approaching each child and family with equity.
- Ensure interactions with children and families reflect the Service Philosophy and bestchance policies and procedures.
- Maintain confidentiality on all issues relating to children and families and comply with the bestchance Early Years Management's Privacy and Confidentiality Procedure.

Cheshire School Rotation – Education Support Officer

- Provide support to the teachers and individual students to assist in the delivery of an integrated, innovative, flexible curriculum which meets the individual needs of each student
- Under the supervision of teaching and ancillary team members, implement consistent behaviour management strategies within the classroom and playground, and for group work and excursions

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- Under supervision, work with students to build self-esteem through a variety of appropriate educational methods to encourage individual creativity, task completion and the development of self confidence in learning
- Assist in actively developing the students' social skills
- Under supervision, assist team members in the orientation program for students prior to their placement in the school

Children's Therapy Services (CTS) Rotation - Key Worker

- Plan and deliver high quality services for children and families, which are consistent with Children's Therapy Services Guiding Principles of Practice.
- Work within the Transdisciplinary model, including acting as a Key Worker for allocated families to support them to coordinate their child's developmental and therapeutic needs.
- Build family member's capacity to respond to the needs of their family and to access community resources.
- Deliver services within working hours through effective planning, in line with targets for billed hours.
- Provide culturally-responsive services.
- Record data and provide documents according to reporting requirements in an accurate and timely manner.
